## **RESTAURANTS**

### ***Le Semaphore***

The best restaurant for miles around. As well as superb views it has wonderful views of the sea and Channel Islands from its commanding clifftop location. Best place to eat is in the conservatory. Take your coffee outside and look at the scenery and the remains of the old wooden semaphore.

### ***Le Bouche à Oreille***

This is a hidden treasure a 10 minute walk from the harbour.

Michel and his wife cope alone with a very busy and popular restaurant, where much of the food is cooked over a wood fire.

There's an outside sitting area for drinks and coffee.

### ***Hotel du Phare***
